

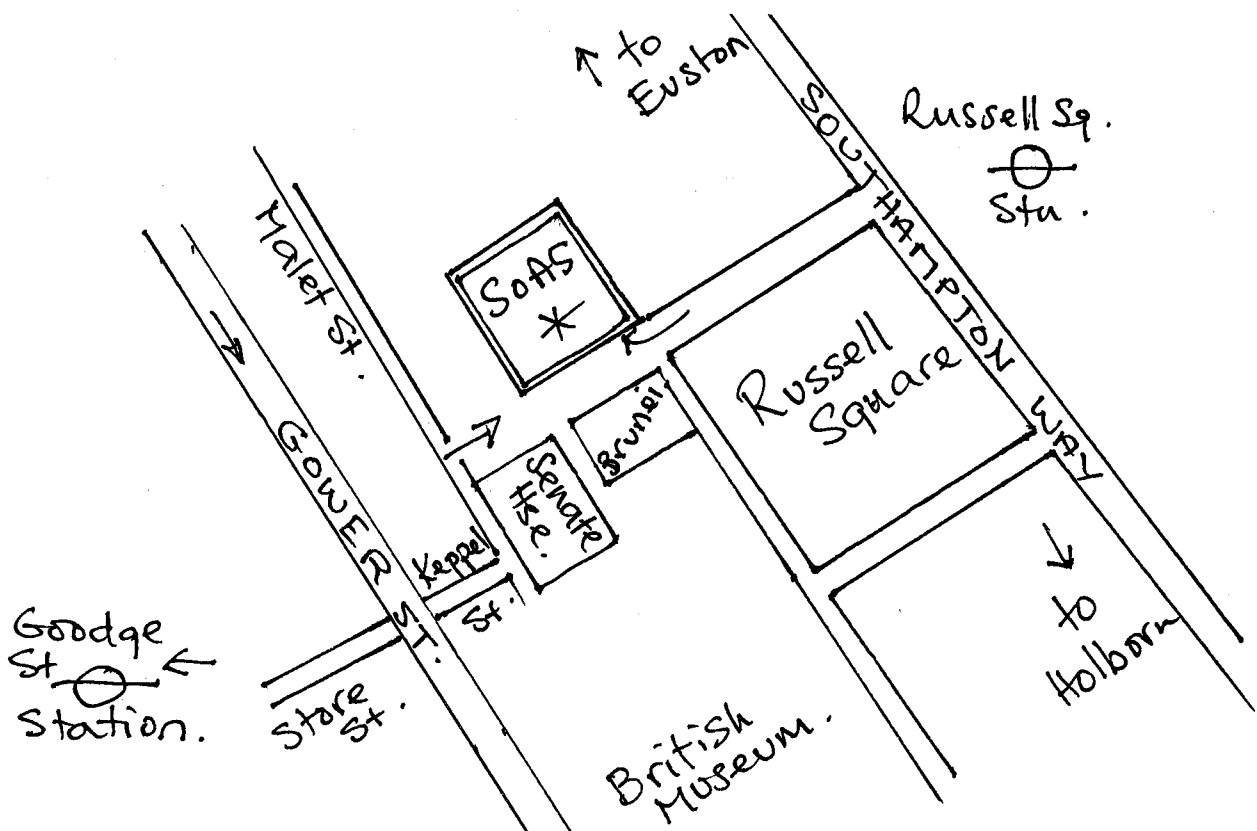
## How to get to the event at SOAS on October 14...

The event is in the Khalili Lecture Theatre at the School of Oriental and African Studies. See map below. The nearest Underground stations are Russell Square Station, to the east, and Goodge Street Station, to the west. The nearest buses run up and down Southampton Way on the east side of Russell Square (Nos. 59, 68, 168, 188, 91) and southwards down Gower Street to the west (Nos. 10, 14, 24, 29, 73, 134, 390).

If you come by bus down Southampton Way get off at Russell Square, and walk along the top edge of the square to the north-west corner. As you cross Thornhaugh Street and enter the SOAS courtyard, the main SOAS building you are seeking is the one on the right, up a steep flight of steps. (It is opposite/facing the building called the Brunei Gallery, which is to your left).

If you approach by bus down Gower Street, get off at the stop after Waterstones bookshop/café, announced as "Chenies Street". Walk onwards a few yards, turn left into Keppel Street and thence into Malet Street. The large white Senate House is facing you. Cross towards it over Malet Street, turn left and walk a few yards, up its pavement, then turn right into a pathway through the fence into SOAS courtyard. The SOAS main building you are heading for is at the bottom end of this courtyard on your left.

As you enter the glass doors of this main SOAS building you come into an entrance space with a reception desk. If you are meeting up with others, a good place to wait is just to the left in here.



## To get to the Khalili Lecture Theatre...

It is probably best to tell the receptionist at the desk what you have come for. Then turn to the right and pass through the turnstiles. Go left, and a few yards further left again, down a flight of stairs to the lower ground floor. As you touch ground, turn left and pass through some open double doors, up a slight ramp and walk towards some lift doors that are facing you. When you reach these lifts look to your right. Immediately adjacent you will see double glass doors. Go through them. You are now in the entrance hall to the Khalili Lecture Theatre. This is the space in which people will gather before going into, or after exiting, the speaking event. This is where the reception will be held at the end of the book launch. There will be five tables, one for Pluto Press to display and sell books, and one each available for Women in Black, WILPF, Women for Refugee Women and Feminist Review to display their materials.

The lecture theatre itself is through solid doors at the far end of this entrance hall.
