Performance Notes

- i) The majority of the choir should sing Voice A throughout.
- ii) Voices B, C and D should each be sung by a small number of singers, e.g. 3 in a choir of 20.
- iii) When not singing Voices B, C and D, the singers assigned to those parts should sing Voice A.
- iv) The song should start very softly and take a gradual crescendo up to the beginning of Verse 4, before following a slow diminuendo to the end.
